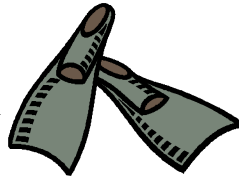

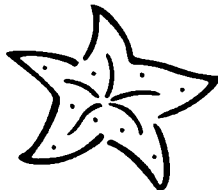

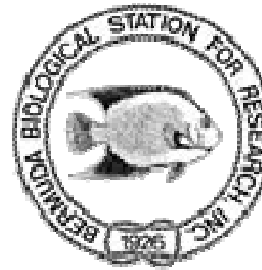

Students will be selected by trip chaperones after reviewing all applications and references from guidance counselors and science teachers.

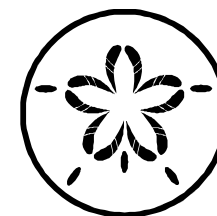
